**Updates**

Forest Hills: January meeting which was cancelled due to snow has been rescheduled for next Tuesday, February 13 at Forest Hills School Library. Topics will include traffic and parking, trees, lot splits. Forest Hills plan will be presented to FAN before going to the City.

Trees: Meeting with David Odum, City arborist February 15, ACC downstairs (he will have the Tree Committee's questions in advance).

LONAC: Joel Komerek talked about the lake interceptor (may move it out of the lake), water rights and other water issues. [www.lakeinterceptor.com](http://www.lakeinterceptor.com)

Alleys: Lisa Shaw has volunteers willing to help people clear their alleys or gain access with gates. If people have concerns, have them contact Lisa. The City and Allied will send out joint communications to neighbors about the process of switching garbage/recycling pickup to the alleys.

**Cleanstreams Presentation**

Ed Swartz took photos in December during a period of heavy rains. Goal is to get City to handle surface water runoff higher up in the neighborhood, e.g. by adding catch basins around E Avenue and 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Streets.

We need to control our leaves better; 30% to 50% of surface water problem is related to leaves. Subcommittee formed to focus on "Leaf Management"; Jim Bolland (subcommittee chair), Joe Lebens and Shari Newman volunteered.

**New Business**

The Oregonian: Newspaper boxes have been removed; the neighborhood association requested only that unused boxes be removed. Can call the Oregonian to get your box back or specify where you want the paper, e.g. on your porch.

Stop Signs: New configuration will be implemented in phases. Signs will be added first at intersections that currently have none. Need to have signage giving 90-day notice before turning or moving stop signs. Implementation will be more costly than originally estimated.

Height Limits: Developer at 6<sup>th</sup> and D got exemption to build higher than 28ft for new home. Apparently, builder can go 6ft above limit on 30% of the roof.
